



The Documentation Center of Cambodia (DC-Cam) wants to highlight its overarching endeavor to dramatically increase the Center's strategic depth in grassroots action in 2020. DC-Cam is reminded that it would not be able to achieve this initiative without the generous and steadfast support of the U.S. government, Cambodian government, European Union, and United Nations Development Programme. This overarching endeavor complements its direct actions by way of building the Center's capacity in reaching the majority of all Cambodians in the countryside.

Starting in 2020, DC-Cam will have six provincial offices. They are below with official name in English:

- 1) Public Information Room, Phnom Penh/Kandal province
- 2) Anlong Veng Peace Center, Oddar Meanchey province
- 3) Prey Veng Documentation Center, Prey Veng province
- 4) Takeo Documentation Center, Takeo province
- 5) Veal Veng Reconciliation Center, Pursat province
- 6) Kampong Cham Documentation Center, Kampong Cham province

In addition, DC-Cam has already established a new, second office for its headquarters (HQ) in Phnom Penh. This new office, DC-Cam HQ building 2, encompasses approximately over 3,000 square feet of new office space, meeting rooms, and reading rooms/libraries. The office was officially opened for business in December 2019, but DC-Cam will be making improvements and refinements to this space throughout 2020. Altogether, DC-Cam will be in 7 locations across Cambodia. With these new centers, the Center will become an organization with true strategic depth—a depth that reaches every region in Cambodia, which cannot be easily matched by any other civil society organization in Cambodia today.
